

Local use of the examples from the downloads.

The simplest variant:

“You may want to create a separate browser profile / shortcut used just for local development to be safe.”

It is safest to install an **extra browser** for **local work** only. Then you can't accidentally be online with insecure settings because of the different design.

Besides the common browsers you can install for example SeaMonkey (firefox compatible).

If you set it to offline, the browser remembers this when you restart. You do not have to bother.

Allow local textures:

about:config (in addressbar) - click on “Accept the Risk and Continue” (if is visible) set **privacy.file_unique_origin** to **false**

??? However, the **privacy.file_unique_origin** does not exist. ???

This is not a problem:

Right-click - New - Boolean
insert: **privacy.file_unique_origin**
OK and use **false**
